- 1914 ABIC has 9 employees in their factory (state inspection)
- 1916 ad introduces the "New Professional Model Cornet" (*Music Trade Review*); Harry W. Belknap, manager, #207-1/2 Monroe Ave. (directory)

- 1918 ABIC is on union list for band instruments, Grand Rapids
- 1919 Amer. BIC, #207-1/2 Monroe, Walter W. Wilkins, mgr.
- 1922 same location and manager (directory)
- 1923 Amer. Band Inst. Co., #710 W. Jackson, Chicago (dir)

Most brass instruments found are from Chicago.

Bottom euphonium has a Pan American serial number from about 1922 and is the "American Educator" model.

I am not certain if the two locations are the same company without finding more city directories. The top cornet is labeled "Chicago" yet does not match the 1916 ad above.
