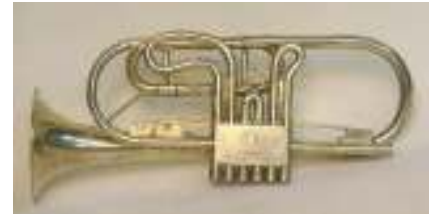


Graves & Co.

Boston, Massachusetts

- 1824-30 Samuel Graves Jr. making instruments in W. Fairlee, Vt.
1830-50 Graves moves to Winchester, New Hampshire (census)
1850 Samuel Graves arrives sometime after the July 1850 Boston Directory
1851 Graves & Co. are listed at #18 Harvard Place as well as Samuel; T. Berteling moves here from Wright & Co.
1852 now George M. Graves & Co. with T. Berteling and Samuel
1853 now Graves & Co. (George M. & Oscar O. Graves) along with Berteling, Samuel Graves & Oliver G. Graves (brass finisher) (directory)
1854 Graves & Co. is now George Graves & S.W. Draper at #18 Harvard with Samuel; Oscar not listed; Berteling now moved to #17 Harvard (dir)
1855 Graves & Co. just George at #68 Albany St.; Samuel absent
1858 Graves & Co. now Samuel G. & George Freemantle with George M. Graves listed separately (dir)
1860 Graves & Co. now listed with Samuel only (dir)
1861 George Freemantle returns and now there are three Graves; Samuel, George and Elbridge W. Graves (dir)
1862 Samuel & Elbridge are back at #18 Harvard St. (dir)
1863 Elbridge, George & Samuel are listed at #18 Harvard
1864 Gilmore, Graves & Co. is formed at #18 Harvard (dir)
1866 Gilmore now gone (dir)
1867 Wright, Gilmore & Co is under William E. Graves at #71 Sudbury St.; Samuel, George & Elbridge join them
1868 Samuel no longer listed (retired after stroke in 1870)
1869 The Boston Musical Instrument Mfy. is formed by the Graves along with Wright, Henry Esbach & L. Hartman
1871 William is now gone (dir)
1874 Elbridge Graves listed for Brown's Band at #11 Chester St.; George still at #71 Sudbury as instrument maker (dir)
1875 Both Elbridge & George are at #11 Chester St. (dir)
1876-77 Only George is left and now at #96 W. Springfield St.
