

David C. Hall

Boston, Massachusetts

- 1822 David is born in Lyme, New Hampshire
- 1853 David Hall becomes the leader of the Boston Brass Band and is known as an excellent keyed bugle player
- 1855 Hall is a musician located at #7 Court St. (directory)
- 1856 Hall moves to #292 Washington St. (dir)
- 1861 Now Allen & Hall with Joseph Lathrop Allen at #334 Washington St. (photo 2)
- 1862 Hall alone at #334 Wash. (dir)
- 1864 Hall moves to #112 Congress St. with the Quinby Bros.
- 1865 brother Rhodolph Hall is a musician at the same address (in the top photo David is on left, Rhodolph on right)
- 1866 Now using Hall & Quinby name (photos 3 & 4) (dir)
- 1867 Hall & Quinby moves to #62 Sudbury St. (dir)
- 1871 Joined by E. G. Wright & Co.; Wright dies that year leaving his tools & stock to Hall & Quinby
- 1875 Hall's Band is listed at #62 Sudbury St. (dir)
- 1876 Hall leaves the Quinbys and sells musical instruments at #126 Court St. (photos 5 to 7) (dir); catalog shows Hall instruments made by Lecompte & Quinby Bros.
- 1879 Hall now at #44 Sudbury St. (dir)
- 1881 Hall now at #59 Bromfield St. & #17 Montgomery Place
- 1882 Hall now back at #292 Washington St. (dir)
- 1883 Hall now at #89 Court St. (dir)
- 1887 Hall now at #178 Washington St. (dir)
- 1891 no listing for Hall for two years
- 1893 Hall is back as a manufacturer of musical instruments at #48 Hanover St, room 15 (dir)
- 1898 Hall now at #103 Court St. (dir)
- 1900 Hall dies on February 11th
