

Anton Heinzmann

Cincinnati, Ohio

- 1866 Anton (Anthony) Heinzmann (1835-1912) emigrates to US from Austria
- 1868 son Anthony Charles H. is born; his wife is Selma Voigt (the Voigt family of Germany may be the source of his instruments)
- 1869 Anton Heinzmann, laborer, h. #159 Saratoga, Cincinnati
- 1870 Anton H., musical instruments, #460 Vine St. (directory)
- 1871 same listing
- 1872-1889 A.H., restaurant or saloon , #460 Vine St.; Anthony Jr. is a musician at the same address (dir)
- 1900 Anthony Sr. is a farmer, son is musician (census)
- 1912 Anthony Sr. dies, buried in Newport, KY
- 1920 Anthony Jr., doorman for theater (census)
- 1930 Anthony Jr. dies, retired musician

The tuba on the right was found in a scrap yard near St. Paul, Minnesota in 2013 and dates to 1870-1871. The only other tuba I could find record of is an OTS horn in the Schubert Club Museum in St. Paul in the 1980s. Could this be the same horn later damaged and thrown away?
