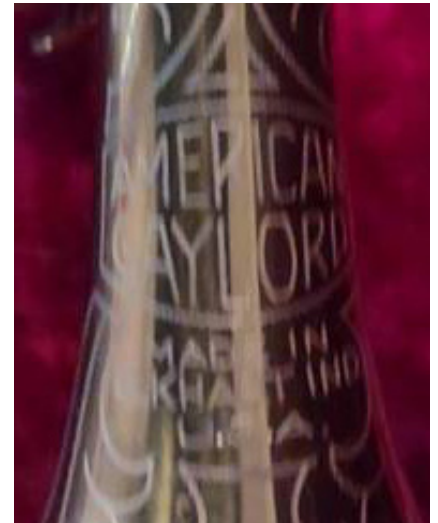
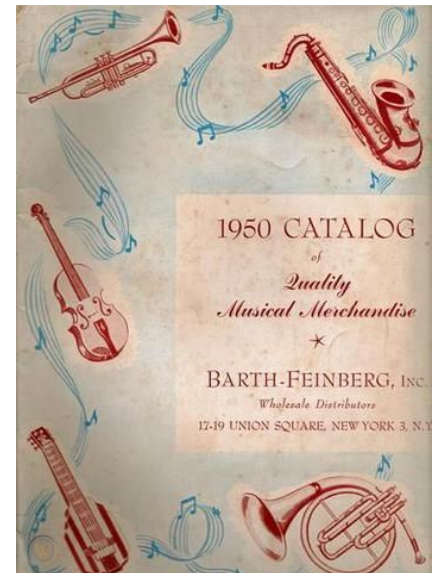


American Gaylord Band Instruments

Barth – Feinberg Inc, New York

- 1923 Barth-Lutchen-Feinberg was founded in New York City as a wholesale musical instrument supplier, distributing imported and domestic band instruments. Started by Albert Barth, Morris Lutchen, and Henry Feinberg, Lutchen passed away in 1927, leaving just B-F.
- 1950 B-F catalog included Fidelity band instruments. They were located at 17-19 Union Square in New York City.
- 1952 American Gaylord trumpet #76286 is a stencil of the American Triumph model by Harry Pedler & Sons c.1952 (photos 2 & 3) and made in Elkhart.
- 1958 The B-F catalog included American Gaylord (below) and Pedler & Sons band instruments. These images are the same as the William Frank American Prep models from a 1951 ad (photos 4 & 5). Frank went out of business in 1956 so perhaps stock was purchased by American Gaylord.



- 1965 B-F was bought out and was now New York Music Wholesalers Inc, 277 Park Ave (opencorporates.com).
- 1970 The Targ & Dinner catalog listed B-F as an affiliate.
- 2021 The company name changed to The Corp Trust Co (opencorporates.com).
