A few band instruments have appeared with the name "Gadco" on the bell. The two trumpets that I have photos of are from two different makers, yet both appear to have a 1930s design.

Searching the internet only gave me a few advertisements from *Billboard* magazine dating between 1936 and 1938. The ad below mentioned that Leslie G. Anderson was the president in 1936. The only person that I could find with that name in the 1930 and 1940 US Census records was involved in radio and sound equipment. It's possible that he started this business in 1936, only to have it fail before 1940. Whether or not this company is the same one found on the band instruments is not certain.
