

# Jules (Julius) Lecocq

## New York City

- 1811 Jules Francois Lecocq born in France January 2<sup>nd</sup> (passport application in 1857)
- 1843 son Ernest born in France (census)
- 1845 Jules Lecocq, brass instrument maker, #92 Leonard St. (he shared this address with violin maker Charles Mercier)
- 1846 moved to #132 Leonard St.; Mercier at 44 Canal St. (dir)
- 1853 daughter Julia born (d.1941) in NYC
- 1856 Jules Lecocq, musical inst. maker, #132 Leonard (dir)
- 1857 naturalized on Sept 26; Jules Francois Lecocq
- 1858 Julius Lecocq, musical instruments, #132 Leonard (dir); daughter Louise born (d.1937) in NYC
- 1861 manufacturer of metal musical instruments with piston, pump & rotary valves, #132 Leonard (AMD)
- 1868 awarded patent #73,614 for wire body supports; clerk, h.#65 3<sup>rd</sup> (dir)
- 1870 this is the only Census I can find him on; born in France, married to Julia (b.1816), 2 daughters at home, listed as a photographer
- 1871 Julius Lecocq, no occupation, h. #71 3<sup>rd</sup> Ave. (dir)
- 1874-76 gone from NYC directory
- 1877 Jules Lecocq, no occ., h. #828 E. 51<sup>st</sup> St. (dir)
- 1878 back to #132 Leonard (dir), no occupation
- 1885 Jules Lecocq, h. #132 Leonard St., Brooklyn, no occupation given; son Ernest is a photographer (dir)
- 1887 Jules dies on November 13<sup>th</sup>; he is said to have been in NYC for 40 years and was an expert gun & pistol maker (he is not listed under gun makers in the city directories)
