- 1859 Julius John Neumann was born on June 23 in Russia (death record).
- 1879 Neumann emigrates to Chicago (census).
- 1880 Musical instrument maker (census).
- 1885 Instrument maker at 200 Wabash; home at 212 W. Chicago Ave (city directory) [probably w/L&H].
- 1892 Foreman at 162 State St w/L&H (city directory).
- 1900 Foreman at 7 Bryan St at L&H factory (city directory).
- 1900 Files for a patent on a mute on September 29.
- 1902 Foreman for L&H at 7 Bryan Pl factory (city directory).
- 1903 Granted patent #738,472 for mute (patent).

Newman Professional Mutes.


Has the advantage over the old style that it allows the air to escape freely through the mute and softens the tone of the instrument to a much greater extent. It is invaluable for practice purposes as well as for the mute effect in cornet solo.

- 1911 The "Newman Professional Mute" (photo 1) is sold by Sears. Neumann, Nobert & Co, electroplaters, 214 N. State St (city directory).
- 1920 Gold & Silver plating of musical instruments; home at 621 Barry Ave (census).
