Vega Power Special Trumpets

1945 - 1960s

The earliest ad that I have found for the Power Special trumpets is this one at right from September of 1947. These had a completely different design compared to the pre-WWII Power model and may have been stencils made for Vega in Elkhart.

This model begins the final era of Vega brass instruments and the uncertainty of when and by whom these were actually made. The serial number of 38xxx would suggest that this was made in 1938, yet it is unlikely that this style of Power model would have been made at the same time as the earlier one.

The closest match that I have found for the valve style is the early Signet model trumpets made by Blessing for H&A Selmer of Elkhart.

Since Blessing was an earlier supplier of valves for Vega, it would follow that they later would make complete horns.

It is said that the first Signet brass were made in 1940.
