Vega Triumphal Trumpets

1929 - 1932 & Post-WWII

The earliest advertisement that I have found for the Triumphal model was from May of 1929. Examples have been found with serial numbers ranging from 29100 to 30141, so it's possible that these were only made for one year. There are very few examples of Vega instruments in the 30k range and none in the 31k range, leading me to believe that the Great Depression put a halt to their sales.

In keeping with the trend set by Conn in 1928, this had a streamlined design that would become popular during the early 1930s. The Advanced Triumphal replaced this by November of 1932; perhaps due to Vega trying to generate sales in this difficult time.
